PRESIDENTIAL MESSAGE OCTOBER 2019

Rotary's long-term, sustained **battle against polio** has defined our organization for decades. We have a right to be proud of all that we have accomplished through the years. Our progress is real and noteworthy. **In 1988**, polio was endemic in **125 countries**, with more than **350,000 new cases** a year worldwide. Since then, Rotary and our Global Polio Eradication Initiative partners have reduced the incidence of polio by more than 99.9 percent, vaccinated more than 2.5 billion children against the virus, and prevented 18 million cases of paralysis. Over the years, Rotary has helped country after country move into the polio-free column. This includes India, which some considered impossible not long ago. Of the three types of poliovirus, type 2 has been eradicated and type 3 could soon be certified as eradicated. Nigeria has not reported a case of wild poliovirus in nearly three years. If this trend holds, **we will be down to just one type of wild poliovirus in only one section of the world, Afghanistan and Pakistan.**

There are major challenges in that region. But it is crucial that we remain optimistic. Look at all that we have accomplished so far. This is no time to get discouraged or to think that the task is impossible. We will end polio forever, but only if we remain steadfast and vigilant. **World Polio Day** is a time for Rotarians from all over the globe to come together, recognize the progress we have made in our fight against polio, and plan the action we must take to end polio forever. The key word is action, because we still have important work to do.

This year, we want to see as many Rotary clubs as possible holding World Polio Day events around the world. Need some ideas? How about **organizing a viewing party** for friends and club members to watch Rotary's Online Global Update? You could also **dedicate a club meeting to World Polio Day** or create a **fundraising event**. Remember, every dollar raised is matched 2-to-1 by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation.

Once you have created an event, register it at endpolio.org/register-your-event. Then promote it using the

World Polio Day toolkit, available at endpolio.org/world-polio-day.

Mark your calendar to tune in to **Rotary's World Polio Day Online Global Update on 24 October**. This year we will stream our program on Facebook in multiple time zones around the world. Visit the Rotary International Facebook page to RSVP to your region's program. And do not forget to follow the event on social media and share it with your network.

When we reach our goal, polio will become only the second human disease eradicated on the planet, and Rotary will receive international acclaim. But what matters most is **the children who will never again have to face this terrible, disabling virus**. Rotary must continue to connect the world in the effort toward polio eradication. It is up to us. **Let us finish the job.**

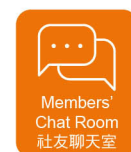

END POLIO: WE ARE THIS CLOSE

I had an experience on a National Immunization Day (NID) in New Delhi, India in about end January of 2011, as one of the delegates from District 3450 led by DG Jason Chan (2010-11). It was a 6-days trip site visit in some poor villages in New Delhi. We were met with WHO, UNICEF, and National Polio Committee with orientation getting to learn about Polio Eradication and Poliovirus.

During the NID program, we were arranged to visit different booths to observe and participate in immunization, door to door immunizing the children, and finally visited St. Stephen's Hospital and Rotary Blood Bank.

What is Polio? Poliomyelitis is a highly infectious disease that most commonly affects children under the age of 5. Most know it as poliovirus. The virus is spread person to person, typically through contaminated water. It can attack the nervous system, and in some instances, lead to paralysis. Although there is no cure, there is a safe and effective vaccine - one which Rotary and our partners use to immunize over 2.5 billion children worldwide.

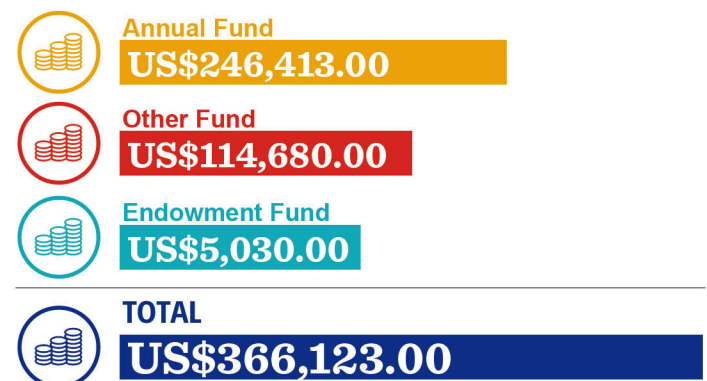
As we are about coming up to End-Polio worldwide, I strongly encourage our Rotarians in D3450 to support fundraising this year.

Funding is needed to eradicate polio. There are fewer polio cases today than ever before, but we will not stop until we reach zero. We are This Close to a polio-free world, and we need your help.

Remember that the Gates Foundation will match every \$1 Rotary commits to polio eradication 2-to-1, up to **US\$50 million per year**.

Meeting discussions include but not limited to:

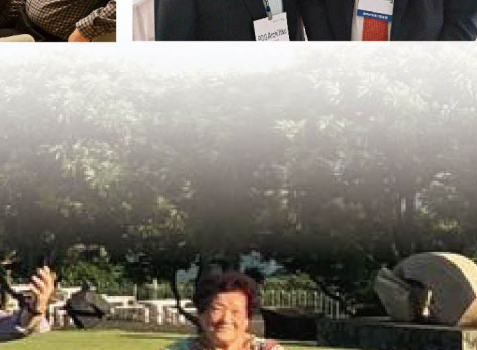
- Governor-nominee Selection Methods

MAKING AN IMPACT WITH THREE LOCAL UNSUNG HEROES

三位香港無名英雄以其生命影響生命

Recently, THE ONE Hong Kong Award Chair PDG HW Fung, International Award Co-Chair PDG Eugene Fong and Stewardship Chair PP Grace Yen distributed the prize monies to the awardees of THE ONE Hong Kong Humanitarian Award 2019.

近日香港無名英雄獎主席馮興宏前地區總監聯同國際獎聯合主席方奕展前地區總監和善款管理委員會主席嚴中明前社長分發獎金予各2019年度香港無名英雄獎得獎者。

Award champion **Maria Law** will put her cash prize of HK\$200,000 towards maintaining Holy Café's kitchen appliances and furniture, a new air-conditioning unit, and its weekly food distribution programme for 170 elderlies for 26 weeks. The café will continue to provide vocational training to special-needs staff and teach them the value of helping others less fortunate.

首名得主**羅孟君女士**將用其20萬港元獎金為喜樂餐飲教室維修廚房及添置包括抽風系統的設備。其餘獎金將會支持她派飯給170位長者26週。喜樂教室會繼續為有特殊需要的員工提供在職培訓和灌輸他們助人為快樂之本的價值觀。

Maria was nominated by PP Stanley Yuen of RC Tsuen Wan. 羅女士的提名人是荃灣社社長袁志偉先生。

Runner-up **Chow Shu Tak** will designate his prize money of HK\$80,000 to feed two homeless beneficiaries for 180 days, one living under a bridge who is mute and deaf and the other with an intellectual disability. Partial funds will go towards a winter fundraiser organised by the Lord Grace Church of Hong Kong to purchase cold weather essentials for impoverished elderly.

Runner-up **Nip Yeung Sing** has put his cash prize of HK\$80,000 to the "Friends of the Setting Sun" programme at Banyan Services Association. The funds will cover the after-death expenses for destitute elderly, including obtaining death certificates, purchasing coffins and memorial tablets, arranging cremations, funerals and vigils held by volunteers.

入校為中學生提供免費心肺復甦訓練

訓練接近千名中學學生

香港心臟專科學院曾做一個研究,以40至60歲人士為例,一年內因突發性心肌梗塞死亡人次達1000人。根據香港大學李嘉誠醫學院急症醫學部於2012至2013年的數據發現,香港院外突發性心臟驟停患者存活率僅2.3%,較其他亞洲地區屬嚴重偏低。面對緊急事故時,97%受訪者都願幫手報警,但不足20%人會為患者使用(AED)。有見及此,香港東北扶輪社致力提供免費心肺復甦訓練予市民,希望可提升香港人的急救知識水平。自2015年起,國際扶輪3450地區及香港東北扶輪社,聯同聖約翰救護機構合作,舉行大型的心肺復甦訓練—「國際扶輪3450地區心肺復甦教育計劃」。2015-2017,已訓練近3,000名的市民。自去年起,香港東北扶輪社更把計劃伸延至大學及中學,並為多間中學提供入校訓練,現已有1,000名學生能完成完成訓練課程並取得證書。

計劃重點—入校訓練中學學生

香港東北扶輪社前社長 黃顯榮亦分享:「希望由年青人的教育開始,將急救知識慢慢推廣。亦希望一班年青人可以有助人的精神。」他表示大部份的歐美國家,甚至亞洲地區的新加坡、日本及南韓,已將心肺復甦及AED機的應用及認知,加入學校課程內;而這方面的發展香港相對比較後進,相關知識亦不夠普及,因此他更希望可把訓練廣及本土的學校。東北扶輪社考慮到基層學生未必可負擔報讀心肺復甦課堂的費用,故今年計劃亦推展至部份基層學校,中學中四及中五的學生全體免費學習心肺復甦法。

HOW TO CREATE POWERFUL IMAGES

Our photography requires Rotarians in action, depicting them in powerful images that capture the public's attention and ignite real emotion.

This is what will make our campaign successful. Here's a checklist for how People of Action photos should look and feel:

- The image represents genuine, unstaged moments of Rotarians at work.
- It shows a clear visual narrative that represents the headline.
- Subjects' faces and actions should be positive, happy, and engaging.
- Work with warm and natural lighting. Often, natural light in the early morning and late afternoon achieves the best results.
- Make sure you represent the diversity of your club in age, ethnicity, and gender. Highlight these qualities in your photos. You want people in your community to see themselves in the photo — this will help grab their attention.
- If the project has beneficiaries on site, capture some images of Rotarians interacting with the beneficiaries that represent the work of the project.
- Ask yourself, "Will people in my community connect with what they see in the photo?"
